USA. How Millennials Could Upend Wall Street and Corporate America

By 2020, Millennials will comprise more than one of three adult Americans. It is estimated that by 2025 they will make up as much as 75 percent of the workforce. Millennials' desire for pragmatic action that drives results will overtake today's emphasis on ideology and polarization as Boomers finally fade from the scene. Thus, understanding the generation's values offers a window into the future of corporate America.

Zwaziland. Skills and Youth Entrepreneurship in Africa: Analysis with Evidence from Swaziland

The shortages of entrepreneurial skills have lowered search effectiveness of potential young entrepreneurs and the rate of youth start-ups. Our paper contributes to closing a gap in the entrepreneurship and development literature with a model of costly firm creation and skill differences between young and adult entrepreneurs. The model shows that for young entrepreneurs facing high costs of searching for business opportunities, support for training is more effective in stimulating productive start-ups than subsidies. The case for interventions targeted at youth rises in societies with high costs of youth unemployment. We test the role of skills and training for productive youth entrepreneurship on data from a recent survey of entrepreneurs in Swaziland.

Europe. <u>Use of validation by enterprises for human resource and career development purposes</u>

Based on a survey of 400 enterprises, 20 in-depth case studies and interviews with human resource experts in 10 countries, this report analyses the main purposes of competence assessment, the standards and methods applied, the employee groups targeted and the way results are documented and used.

Community-based learning in vocational education and training: making schools closer to the real world

Community-based learning is a potential learning model for vocational training and

education that enables schools and the real world to become closer. A community-based learning paradigm is built on the principle that it is not enough for us only to help students achieve academic skills in school, but we must also strengthen their involvement in productive activities that can deliver them to enter the adult world. This paper sets forth several ideas pertaining to community-based learning programs and their potential to overcome the gaps of what is done in school with what the public demands; strategies of community-based learning program development; project-based learning as a model of that learning; and a recommendation for carrying out community-based education.

<u>Australian vocational education and training statistics: apprentices and trainees</u> 2014

This annual publication provides a summary of training activity in apprenticeships in Australia, including information on training rates and duration of training. State/territory cuts of data are also available in Excel format. As at 31 December 2014, 2.7 per cent of Australian workers were employed as an apprentice or trainee, with 12.9 per cent of teenage workers (aged 15 to 19 years) employed as an apprentice or trainee.

Turkey. The Impact of Vocational Training for the Unemployed Experimental Evidence from Turkey

The average impact of training on employment is positive, but close to zero and

statistically insignificant, which is much lower than either program officials or applicants expected. Over the first year after training, the paper finds that training had statistically significant effects on the quality of employment and that the positive impacts are stronger when training is offered by private providers. However, longer-term administrative data show that after three years these effects have also dissipated.

USA. The Class of 2014. The Weak Economy Is Idling Too Many Young Graduates

Working paper;

The Great Recession officially ended in June 2009. However, the labor market has made agonizingly slow progress toward a full recovery, and the slack that remains continues to be devastating for workers of all ages. Though the labor market is headed in the right direction, it is improving very slowly, and the job prospects for young high school and college graduates remain dim.

Africa. Advancing TVET for Youth Employability and Sustainable Development 17-18 September 2013, Abuja, Nigeria

The forum's objective was to provide an opportunity for UNEVOC centres and TVET experts in Africa to address contemporary challenges with regard to the quality of TVET delivery, and demand-driven approaches to advancing GTVET and skills development for youth. Thus it provided a platform for sharing knowledge, experiences and promising practices (PPs) in TVET, focusing on GTVET and skills development for youth in the region. The objective was also to reinforce and extend regional networks and partnerships for advancement of TVET transformation towards regional harmonization and resource mobilization, and to further strengthen the UNEVOC Network consolidation process in the region.

Asia and Pacific. <u>Advancing TVET for Youth Employability and Sustainable</u> Development 4–6 September 2013, Seoul, Republic of Korea

The regional forum reflects shared understanding of the key priorities for TVET to support the needs of the youth and skills sector, underpinned by the principles of sustainable development. For the progress made to be built upon, there needs to be shared commitment and pooling of knowledge and resources within and across the region. As well as promoting regional harmony, it is envisaged that this will help those that are still in the process of defining national or sectoral skill strategies, and will sustain those that have started but have yet to see evidence of the long-term impact of skill development on nation-building and regional integration.

EU. Apprenticeship and Traineeship Schemes in EU27: Key Success Factors

The Guidebook's primary aim is to provide an overview of the main apprenticeship and traineeship programmes ('what exists') which have been in operation in each Member State in the period 2007-2012, with a particular focus on their employment outcomes and overall effectiveness. The proven benefits of schemes which combine work and study and allow young people to acquire a first work experience have led to increased recent policy interest at both national and EU level. As a result, apprenticeships and traineeships have become more prominent in the EU's employment and youth policies in recent years.

Europe. E-learning in European Higher Education Institutions

Results of a mapping survey conducted in October-December 2013. The results of this survey are surprising. Apart from a few notable exceptions, almost all institutions are involved in some forms of e-learning. It seems that there has been no sudden and disruptive change, but rather that a gradual adaptation has taken place, which continues at different paces and scales across Europe. Nevertheless institutional responses to MOOCs do suggest that European higher education institutions are capable of responding swiftly to new strategic challenges.

The Hardest Roles to Hire For

Not all jobs are equally easy to fill. It's an obvious point, but one that sometimes gets missed in the debate over whether the American economy is suffering from a "skills gap." Companies complain that there is a shortage of talent, economists counter that if that were true it would be evidenced by rising wages. With wages stagnant, where's the skills gap? What stands out about health care and STEM is that, in contrast with other fields, it's taking longer to hire than it did pre-recession.

Advancing TVET for Youth Employability and Sustainable Development 28-30 October 2013, Moscow, Russian Federation

The three key challenges: to make quality TVET a more effective tool for tackling global youth unemployment; the need to integrate green skills in the curriculum to help promote sustainable development in the workplace; and the importance of improving and harmonizing regional and international co-operation in these fields, focused minds at the meeting for Europe, Commonwealth of Independent States, a post-Soviet governmental alliance that includes Russia, Kazakhstan, Belarus and other former

Soviet republics and North America.

Europe dominates the global league table for skills and education with seven of the top 10 places. There are two representatives from Asia, one from North America, and none from the Middle East and North Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean or Sub-Saharan Africa regions. However, detailed statistics show a more nuanced picture of the investments that nations are making in their people.
